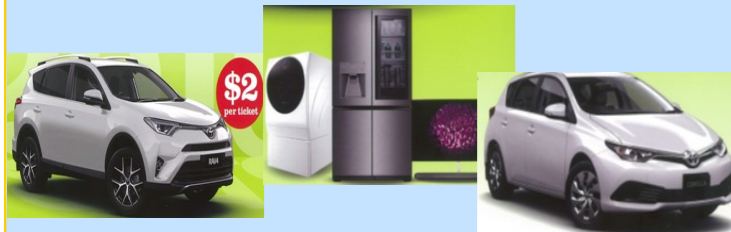

G1 and G2

Y6, Y7 and Y5

This term we will be working on drama skills through improvisation and characterisation in one lesson.

PE in Term 2

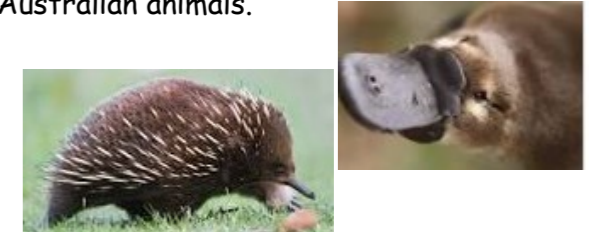
In Term 2 students in the Junior, Middle and Upper Primary will focus on bat and ball skill/games of varying difficulties, as well as skipping.



Science in Term 2

Junior, Middle & Upper Primary

Students will be further studying biology where we will go deeper into the classification of living things based on their characteristics. An incursion is scheduled for week 10 Monday of this term called 'Deadly Australians', where students come up close with many native Australian animals.



Technology in Term 2

Students will be working with code. The definition of code is a system of words, letters, figures, or symbols used to represent others, especially for the purposes of secrecy or program instructions. Students will examine different types and purposes of code as well as use a range of codes in learning tasks - both with and without a computer.
