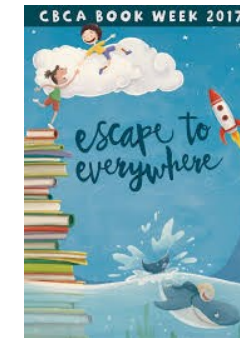
**Lost Property**

### Planetarium Excursion

Today G3 and G4 went to the Planetarium. We travelled in a bus to Mawson Lakes University. We left at 8:50am and arrived approximately at 9:45am.

When we got to the planetarium, we went up stairs to the second floor and sat on the couch. We were introduced to Martin. He led us into a room with red seats, a projector pointing to the roof, and the roof was a screen.

When Martin turned the projector on, we saw Jupiter really clearly. We saw it so big with all its colours and features on it.

Next, we saw Saturn. It had two rings and they were a grey-ish colour. Then Martin zoomed out and showed us the first stars in the sky for the start of the constellation learning.

Martin turned the projector on and turned the roof into the night sky. He showed us which stars were Jupiter and Saturn. He made it look realistic. He showed us that the sky slowly turns and the different constellations in the sky that we could try to find at night. He told us the origins behind the constellations in different cultures. Some of the constellations looked nothing like their origins, but it did not matter. Some of the constellations were centaur, dolphin, scorpion etc.

Next, we saw the Milky Way. It went all across the screen, and was the guideline for the Emu constellation. The Milky Way was many different colours like white, blue, purple, and pink.

Then we watched a movie called "Wildest weather in the Solar System". It was in 3D, so it had many special effects. It was very realistic and we learnt a lot of cool information. eg. There are raining diamonds on Neptune!

We saw all the planets except for Saturn and Uranus; we also saw the weather of two moons: Triton and Titan. There was a spacecraft named Areas, which had different high-tech devices that could go on the planets, and withstand the conditions of them.

I learnt that there were a lot more constellations in the sky than I thought, and that there are different constellations at different times. I also learnt that there are special stars in the sky, and that they have names. I learnt about the different weathers on different planets. There were many bizarre weathers, like sand storms, tornadoes, lightning and raining diamonds.

Finally, we made our way down the stairs and to the bus. The bus ride back to school did not seem as long as the bus ride to the planetarium, but it was as equally as fun.

Overall, the Planetarium was SPECTACULAR!
