

Performing Arts

Term 2 of Performing Arts will focus on preparation for the Music is Fun concert to be held on Friday 30th June (Week 9) at 1.20pm. We will be learning the songs that will be performed by the Music is Fun Band through the use of different activities concentrating on the skills of listening, singing and dancing.



Technology

Y7
This term we will be creating an interactive musical display to share with the school. Students will be designing and creating musical instruments which will be played by code through our makey makeys.

R1, R2, R4, R5, B1, B2,

This term students will be working with storyboards and animation. This will involve working with sequencing of events and creating characters.

G1, G2, G3, Y2, Y3, Y4,

This term students will be working with storyboards and animation. This will involve working with sequencing of events and creating characters and animations using software and apps.

Y4, Y6

This term students will be working with storyboards and animation. This will involve working with sequencing of events and creating characters and animations using software and apps. We will also continue to improve our basic computer skills.

Science

JP

The junior primary grade levels will continue to explore Physical Sciences this Term. They will be looking deeper into movement and forces. Movement of objects in the world around and how forces can change, impact and alter different types movement. The student will complete STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics) projects relating to forces later in the term.

MP

The middle primary grade levels will focus more deeply on motion and the differences between direct and indirect forces. In this physical sciences topic, students will be working towards experimenting with different sized forces and observing their magnitude and impact.

UP

The upper primary year levels will continue to focus exploring how energy can be transferred and transformed. Their engineering skills will be put to the test as they use their knowledge of energy to complete STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics) related projects.



Physical Education

JP

The focus for Term 2 will be continuing to develop fundamental movement skills in a variety of movement sequences and situations. They will also identify rules and fair play when participating in physical activities. With a particular sporting focus on bat and ball skills and skipping.

MP

The focus for Term 2 will be continuing to practise and refine fundamental movement skills in a variety of movement sequences and situations. Students will also be working towards adopting inclusive practices when participating in physical activities and applying basic rules and scoring systems. They will also demonstrate fair play when participating in physical activities and combine elements of effort, space, time, objects and people when performing movement sequences. With a particular focus on Table Tennis and Skipping.

UP

The focus for Term 2 will be to continue to practise specialised movement skills and apply them in a variety of movement sequences and situations. Students will participate positively in groups and teams by encouraging others and negotiating roles and responsibilities. They will Demonstrate ethical behaviour and fair play that aligns with rules when participating in a range of physical activities and apply critical and creative thinking processes in order to generate and assess solutions to movement challenges. They will manipulate and modify elements of effort, space, time, objects and people to perform movement sequences with a particular focus being on Table Tennis and Skipping.
