Science news

Junior Primary

The junior years will discover the observable properties of materials and make judgments to inform them what materials are best suited to purpose and environment. They will also consider what materials are natural and what materials are human invented.

Middle Primary.

Students will explore the 'States of Matter' (solid, liquid & gas) through investigations and experiments and make observation how substances react under different circumstances. Students in the 4/5 grades will investigate the difference between natural and processed resources and how waste or bi products from human invented materials can be re-used and recycled.

Upper Primary.

Students will investigate a variety of separating

techniques used to isolate substances. Whether a reaction can be reversed or not will be a question to ponder, as well as identifying substances as pure or not pure also.

Year 1/2 or 2/3 classes will be trialing a new Primary Connections Science book called 'Machine Makers'. Clovelly Park was accepted by Primary Connections who currently produce curriculum support material to teach the subject of science as one of 50 schools to trail the new books content.

Community Night

Term 4 means Community Night (Wednesday 6th December) preparation in Performing Arts. This year we have a "Back in Time" theme and G1 will be performing the 1960's mix of "Welcome to the 60's" and "Puppet on a string". Please let us know if you have any ideas or bits and pieces for costuming.

G2 and Y3 will be performing the 1980's song "Wake me up before you go go" Please let us know if you have any ideas or bits and pieces for costuming.

G3 and G5 will be performing the 1940's mix of "Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy" and "Chatanooga Choo Choo" Please let us know if you have any ideas or bits and pieces for costuming.

G4 will be performing a 1900's style silent movie, in black, white and grey. Please let us know if you have any ideas or bits and pieces for costuming.

G6 and B2 will be performing the 1920's dance called the Charleston. Please let us know if you have any ideas or bits and pieces for costuming.

R1 and R5 will be performing the 1970's mix of "Ring, Ring" and "I've got a feeling" from the Trolls movie. Please let us know if you have any ideas or bits and pieces for costuming.

R2 and R3 will be performing the prehistoric era to "Walk the Dinosaur" Please let us know if you have any ideas or bits and pieces for costuming.



R4 and Y5 will be performing the 1910's "Be my Baby Bumblebee" Please let us know if you have any ideas or bits and pieces for costuming.

Y1 and Y2 will be performing a time machine song. Please let us know if you have any ideas or bits and pieces for costuming.

B1 will be performing to the 1930's song "Sing, sing, sing (with a swing)" Please let us know if you have any ideas or bits and pieces for costuming.

All Year 7 students will be involved in telling the stories and working with different classes throughout the night. You will get a note home outlining your child's specific role soon. The Year 7's as a group will also perform a mix of "When I'm 64" and "We're the kids of the future" Please let us know if you have any ideas or bits and pieces for costuming, wigs, and walking sticks would be a great start to make them look elderly!

Clovelly Park Community Garden

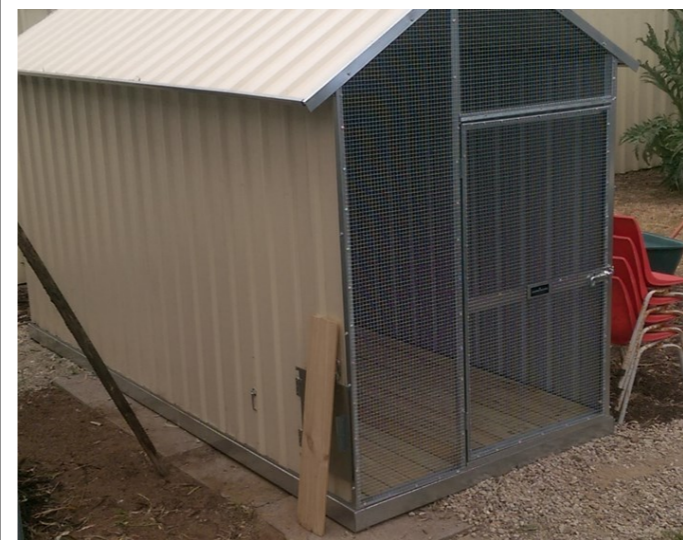
