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

#### Road Safety for Students - Smart Choices

When dropping kids off, ask your children to exit the car on to the footpath, not the road side.

Children should walk on the footpath, never along the gutter.

Cross at the pedestrian crossing or zebra crossings where cars expect children to cross.

Always look **left** then **right** then **left** again.

Wait for the cars to **STOP** before you step off the curb.

Young students should hold an adult's hand when crossing the road.

If you ride a bike to school along the footpath, and you approach people from behind, ring your bell to let them know you are behind them and they can then move to the left of the footpath and let you safely through.



Walk your bike across the road at the crossing.
