

UNIFORM POLICY

DRESS CODE 2019

CLOVELLY PARK PRIMARY

Clovelly Park Primary School expects students to wear the agreed school uniform. This uniform has been determined by the School council in consultation with students, parents and staff.

School Councils now have the responsibility to develop policy on dress codes within their school. The Clovelly Park Primary school community believes the wearing of our school uniform:-

- promotes pride in our school
- enhances our public image
- ensures student safety
- reduces peer group pressures
- encourages appropriate clothing for school activities and excursions
- promotes a sense of equality and equal opportunity that will in turn promote self esteem

School Uniform

Girls Uniform

- navy polo shirt
- navy skirt
- navy track pants/leggings
- parachute pants
- navy knee length shorts
- school dress in school colours
- navy school windcheater
- bomber jacket (available only from uniform shop)

Boys Uniform

- navy knee length shorts
- navy polo shirt
- navy trousers/slacks
- navy track/parachute pants
- navy school windcheater
- bomber jacket (available only from uniform shop)

Footwear

Safe sensible footwear is required. Sandals are acceptable during hot weather

Please Note

All articles of clothing and footwear worn by students must conform to our school policies. They must ensure personal safety and health requirements. They must enable students to participate successfully in all school activities.'

If unacceptable items of clothing are worn (eg. singlets, tank tops, thongs, ugg boots) students will be counselled. Where appropriate parents will also be contacted to seek support for our school dress code.

Hats

In accordance with the school 'Sun Smart' policy all students must wear a hat at all times.

Legionnaire or wide brim hats provide the best protection from the sun. (A range of hats in school colours is available from the uniform shop)

Piercings

Piercings will be limited to a single ear piercing, stud or sleeper. No facial piercings are permitted.

STUDENTS REPRESENTING THE SCHOOL

All students are expected to wear school uniform when representing the school and attending public events, performances and excursions. When playing sport for the school, all students are to wear the appropriate sports uniform. An appropriate hat is to be worn on these occasions.

RESPONSIBILITY

The School Council via the Uniform Committee will be responsible for the

supply and promotion of the school uniform.

The Principal, School Council, staff and students will work together to support the ongoing implementation of this uniform policy.

Parents have the responsibility of supporting the school uniform policy (dress code) by ensuring their child/ren wear the clothing outlined in this policy.

It is the student's responsibility to wear clothing as set out in this policy.

MANAGEMENT

The principal and staff will support the students' compliance with this Uniform Policy and dress code by:-

- expecting students to wear school uniform
- reminding students of the policy and dress code acknowledging compliance with the policy whenever this is practical and appropriate
- providing information about this policy to all newly enrolled families and in the school information package.

The Uniform Shop will ensure adequate supplies of the school uniform are available. This will be the responsibility of the Council Sub-Committee through its convenor.
