Dear Families,

As we are half way through the term, it is timely to remind you of the expectations related to accessing the school grounds to drop off and pick up your children. As we are all aware, our site has restricted access. To ensure the safety of students and school adults, we remind you that the carpark is for staff use only, with the exception of taxi's and adults who have a carpark pass. From Tuesday 12 March you are required to carry your carpark pass as you may be asked to show it prior to gaining access to the carpark to drop off or pick up your child/ren.

We appreciate that finding a park in the surrounding streets is difficult, however encourage you to take this opportunity to park and walk your child/ren into the school grounds. This is an opportunity to reinforce how to safely use the pedestrian crossing. You may have noticed a Police presence outside the school this week. This is to reinforce the road safety message to the broader community when they are driving in the school zone.

If you believe that you would meet the criteria to be allocated a pass, please collect an application form from the front office. Once your application has been considered you will be notified of the outcome. Please note that passes can be revoked and access denied if vehicles do not abide by the speed restrictions or the pass is used by an unauthorised person.

We look forward to your cooperation to ensure the safety of all students.

We have been exploring the use of a communication application to support communication between school and home. We are pleased to announce that we will soon be launching an application called Skoolbag. Skoolbag is successfully used by a large number of South Australian schools. Once we have set up the application we will advise you and provide instructions for you to set it up on your phone or tablet. It is available on both Android and Apple devices. We look forward to introducing this online communication tool to our school community.

As we all know, regular attendance at school is important. All public schools in South Australia have an attendance target of 95%. From now on we will be sharing our progress towards meeting this target in the newsletters. We look forward to reporting on our progress as together we know we can hit the target!

Emmy & Friends

This week we had the first of five sessions of this program. Our students from Reception to Year 2/3 are participating in the program "Learn to be Safe with Emmy and Friends". This is a protective behaviours program facilitated for young children. To prevent potential harm, it is crucial young children learn to identify when they don't feel safe and know safe adults they can ask for help.



The program consists of interactive classes teaching children to identify their feelings, differences between their public and private parts of the body, safe and unsafe secrets and how to manage different situations that make them feel unsafe.

The Child Protection Curriculum is a topic that we are mandated by the government to teach. We encourage parents to look out for each information sheet sent home and revisit the topics with their family.

Wakakirri update

We had our first Wakakirri rehearsal on Monday night. 59 children have joined for 2019 and we started off with some dancing and getting to know you activities as our students are from all year levels and all areas of the school.

We also talked about the theme of our story this year, which is that screen time is lots of fun, but shouldn't be the only thing we do!
