Vacation Care

Vacation Care between 12th April – 23rd April 2021

The next school holidays are fast approaching! Our Vacation Care service offers a program of supervised recreational activities which encourage children to interact with friends, learn life skills, problem solve and be challenged by new experiences in a safe and relaxed environment.

Program

The children will have access to: the pool table, outside play (depending on weather), play station/computer, arts and crafts, and drama. Please see the daily program for details. **The program is subject to Covid -19 restrictions that may be in place at that time.**

Times

Vacation Care is open from 7.00am to 6.00pm. On excursion days, children must be at the centre no later than 30minutes prior to leaving on the excursion. As all staff will be on duty at the excursion no "at home" program will be available on these days.

Fees

The full fee for "at home" days is \$55.00 and \$65 excursion days (less your Child Care Subsidy). Families will be charged for full fees days that their child/children are booked in but do not attend. Please refer to cancellation policy for details. A late fee of \$2.00 per minute per child after 6.00pm also applies. **Bookings need to be made by Wednesday 7TH April** so that correct staffing ratios can be arranged.

PLACES ARE LIMITED. BOOK EARLY TO AVOID DISAPPOINTMENT!

Hot / Wet Weather

Some activities may need to be modified or rescheduled in extreme weather conditions i.e if it is raining or the predicted maximum temperature is 36°C or over. We will endeavour to inform families if there is a change in the program. **ALL CHILDREN ARE REQUIRED TO WEAR APPROPRIATE SUN SMART HATS, CLOTHING AND SHOES OUTSIDE THESE HOLIDAYS.**

Food

The service provides a morning and afternoon snack. Children will need to bring their own lunch unless otherwise stated (NOT cup noodles) and extra snacks for throughout the day. Children will need to bring their own clearly labelled drink bottle that can be topped up during the day.

SPORTS DAY

Next week on Thursday 1 April, we are holding our Sports Day. Students have been allocated into one of the four teams: **Flinders (green), Sturt (blue), Mitchell (yellow), and Marion (red)**. Students are encouraged to wear their team colours on the day. Teachers can provide details about which team your child is in if you need further information about this.

The day will start at 8.45am and concluding at 2pm. Sports day is often a busy day so please ensure your child has a drink bottle filled with water, a school hat and a good-sized, healthy lunch and recess. It is **essential** that your child wears suitable closed in shoes that are appropriate for running.

As it is an outside event, family members are welcome to join us for Sports Day. Physical distancing protocols of 1.5m between adults must be adhered to and will be monitored throughout the day. It is a requirement for all adults to sign in using either our school's QR code or our manual Contact Tracing Record and to sanitise on entry and throughout the day. Children or adults who are mildly unwell must not attend.

To add some excitement to the day for students and start our fundraising for the year, some treats (popcorn, ice-creams and drinks) will be available for students to purchase during break times. Cash only. A coffee van will also be on site for adults to purchase from.

In my family we help each other.

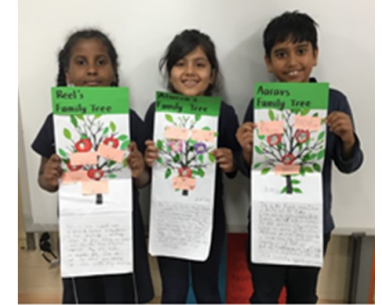
My mum works at Bupa.
