Uniforms

We have been seeing a few students out of uniform in the last few weeks. Please ensure that students are in the correct uniform. I understand it is cold and a coat to get to school is fine as long as underneath there is the regular school uniform.

The change of uniform is still under the consultation and will not be decided upon for a while. Once the Governing Council has all the information and feedback it will make a final decision. Parents will be kept up to date with the process. After the decision is made there will be a 1 year phase in period where families can purchase and change over to the new uniform.

School Reports

Staff are currently finalising school reports. We have been using a new electronic system to support a clear understanding of where your child is currently at. The Australian Curriculum achievement standards are written to give a clear picture of their learning. The standards are written for a child's progress over a whole year so this report gives parents an understanding of how they are going at this time; it is not the final grade for the year.

The reports will be handed out on the last day of term. As this is a new system we are hoping there

will be no hiccups in printing, if for any reason there is a problem we will let you know as soon as possible.

It is important that the school knows if your child is ill or going to be away from school for family reasons. Please make sure that you give us a quick phone call so we can inform the teachers of the reason for their absence and record this on our system.

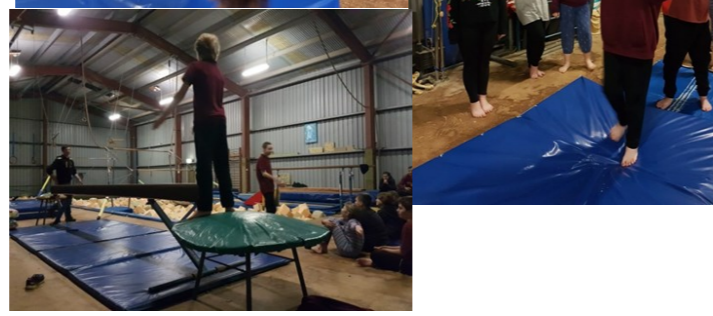
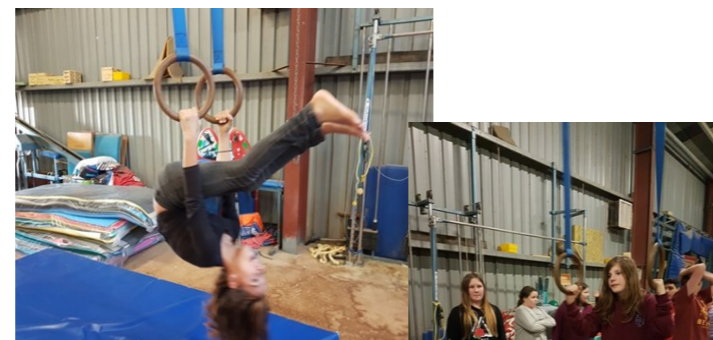
Dangerous Australians - incursion
