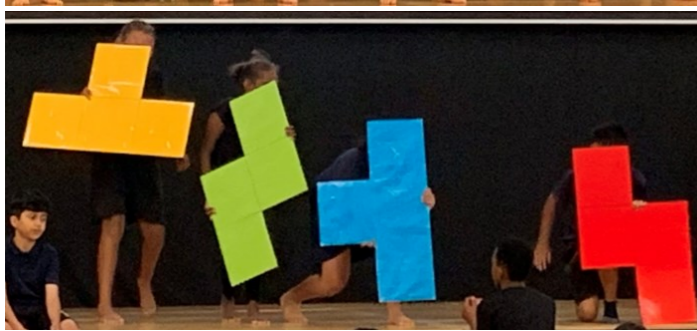

## Science -Term 2



This term in Science we will be looking at the Chemical Sciences. In the Early Years we grapple with the idea that objects are made of materials that behave in certain ways and that they can change physically while serving a particular purpose. In the Primary Years we will be exposed to how solids, liquids and gases have different observable properties and can be changed.

The Middle Years will look at reversible and irreversible changes to materials as well as looking at mixtures and solutions. This is a great opportunity to get into the kitchen to reinforce practical skills and increase our ability to observe with purpose. The Scientific Inquiry process and appreciating Science as a Human Endeavour underpins this learning. This term is a great opportunity for group collaboration and experiencing working with different people to enhance our understanding of Science concepts.

## Performing Arts -Term 2

In Performing Arts this term the learning focus will be on Music. Our learning will compliment the upcoming visit from The Music is Fun Band in Week 10. We will be learning about elements and genre's of music, brass instruments and singing.

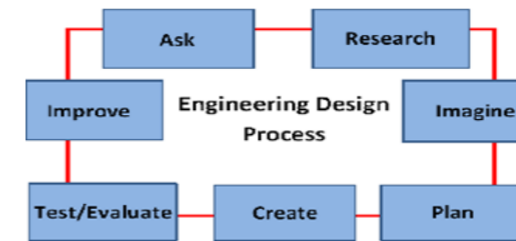


## Design Technology -Term 2

This term in Design Technology, students will be creating with a focus on working with materials, engineering principles and the Design Process.

In Digital Technology, we will be investigating how data can be used to solve problems. In addition to looking at how this is already achieved in our society and environment, we will also be creating our own data representation.

Some students will be working in a small group to plan, develop, make and sell their products. We will be having a market day at the end of the term where all groups will be selling their products with profits going to a charity of the class' choice. Students will be developing their Digital Technologies skills through the investigating, planning, design and marketing requirements of the task.
