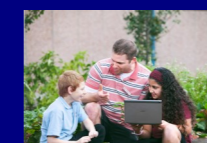

## Hamilton Space School

On 23rd July, G4 and 2 students from Y5 were invited to attend Hamilton Secondary College to mark the 50th anniversary of the moon landing. During the excursion we watched a video of Apollo 11 landing on the moon and were involved in an activity to learn how craters are formed on Earth and the Moon. We were put into groups of three and four and given a large tray of sand as well as flour to identify where and how the craters had formed. We used different sized marbles to drop into the sand and flour mixture from different heights and observed and illustrated what happened. The Hamilton chemistry teacher gave us bottles of water to work as the rain on Earth and empty bottles to represent wind on Earth.

All of these elements were used to see how the different weathering and erosion can effect how the craters are formed on Earth. All of the students that attended this excursion enjoyed the experience and we would love to do it again in the future. We all received personalized certificates of attendance at the end of the session. I would like to thank Ms Crivicich, Mr Rob Polomka and Mr Wayne Campbell for organizing this excursion for us. 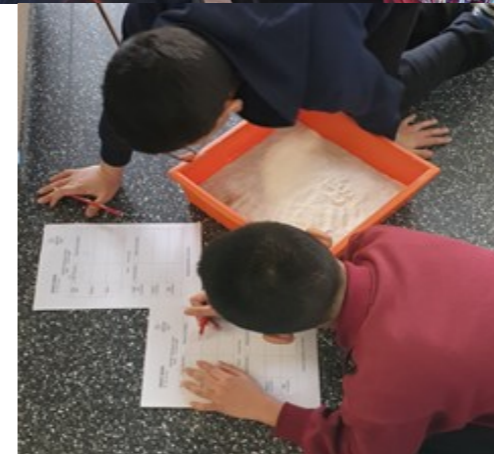
