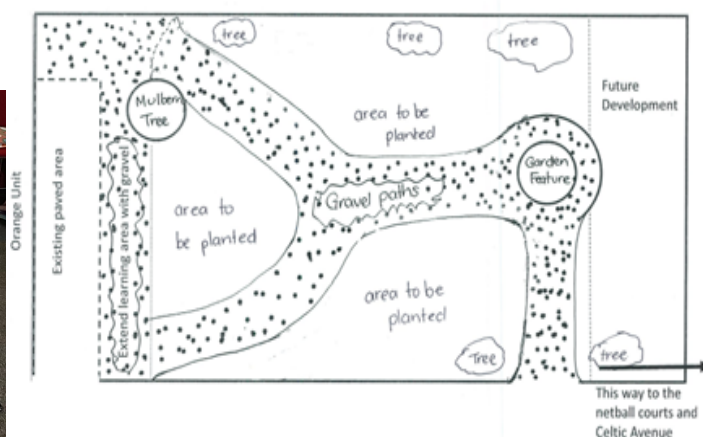
## Butterfly Garden
