The next school holidays are fast approaching! Our Vacation Care service offers a range of supervised recreational activities which encourage children to interact with friends, learn life skills, problem solve and be challenged by new experiences in a safe and relaxed environment.

Program

Regular activities will also be available every day. These include pool table, outside play (depending on weather), play station/computer, arts and crafts, and drama. There is also an excursion to go watch the Dolphins at Port Adelaide. Please see over for the daily program.

Times

Vacation Care is open from 7.00am to 6.00pm. On excursion days, children must be at the centre no later than 8.30am. All staff will be on duty at the excursion so the centre will be closed during this time. <u>Risk assessment for the excursion is</u> available at the service for parents to view.

Fees

The full fee for each day is \$47.00 (less for families with Child Care Subsidy). Families will be charged for days that their child/children are booked in but do not attend. A late fee of \$2.00 per minute per child after 6.00pm also applies. Bookings are required to be made by Friday 21ST September so that appropriate staffing levels can be arranged.

TO ENSURE YOUR PLACE WE REQUEST THAT EITHER FULL FEE OR A PORTION OF THE FEE IS PAID PRIOR TO THE START OF VACATION CARE.

Hot / Wet Weather

Some activities may need to be modified or rescheduled in extreme weather conditions eg if it is raining or the predicted maximum temperature is 36°C or over. We will endeavour to inform families if there is a change in the program. ALL CHILDREN ARE REQUIRED TO WEAR APPROPRIATE SUN SMART HATS AND CLOTHING WHEN OUTSIDE THESE HOLIDAYS.

Food

The service provides a morning and afternoon snack. Children will need to bring their own lunch less stated otherwise (NOT cup noodles) and extra snacks for throughout the day.

The Kaurna Aboriginal picket, represents the original inhabitants of Adelaide, this one along with all of the other pickets represent different cultures who have come to our community to make it the strong vibrant community it is today.

They are pickets of a fence, they represent the idea that even though we may be different, standing together we create strength and unity. Many of our community members have come to Adelaide after being fenced in or fenced out from their country of origin and have left there to start a new and better life. This is a new, connected, happy fence for them here at Clovelly Park Primary.
