Dear Families,

The recent lockdowns both in South Australia and interstate once again remind us that we need to support one another during these unpredictable times. We appreciate your ongoing support as we continue to restrict parents and visitors from entering school grounds and ask you to wear a mask when around others whilst delivering and collecting children at the start and end of the day. If you need to connect/ have a meeting with staff members, please communicate via See Saw, arrange for a connection via the phone or in an online environment.

As you would appreciate, making plans for future school events requires additional flexibility and planning that allows for change, cancellations or alternates.

One such program is the Book Fair we had planned for next week and another is the R-5 Swimming Program planned for the end of August. As the success of the Book Fair relies on volunteers, we have postponed it until Term 4 in the hope that we will then be able to invite parents on site and into buildings to support the smooth running of the Fair.

The Swimming program has also been problematic as pools were shut and the program was stopped during the recent lock down. The decision as to whether school pools would reopen and allow students from other schools to enter their grounds sat with the "owner" of the pool. As you would appreciate, this would not be a decision they would take lightly.

In our situation, the decision was communicated in the last 24 hours by Westminster School that our program could go ahead, however, the timing of the decision along with the limitations in place have impacted on our ability to commit to going ahead with the Swimming program. Our concerns in relation to going ahead include the short time frame to communicate, organise the program and to collect money as we would now be able to start to collect quotes for buses which would result in a maximum of 2 weeks' notice and payment period. We are aware of the likely impact that the reduced period for payments has on families' ability to commit to the program which results in the program potentially being financially non-viable. In addition, parents would not be able to attend the pool and it is highly likely that students would not be able to use change rooms and would need to travel in wet bathers.

Whilst we believe this program is really important, as we have been unable to negotiate alternate dates for our program, we have reluctantly made the decision to cancel the program for 2021. If alternate dates become available, we will reconsider this decision. We strongly encourage families to engage in the VAC Swim program which is offered during early January each year to ensure children have the opportunity to develop water awareness and safety skills.


