Diwali Festival

Many of our students and their families recently celebrated Diwali.

Diwali is a celebration just like Christmas, Eid, The Lunar New Year, NAIDOC Week and many other important events that students at our school celebrate with their families. All cultures have traditions and symbols that are used to celebrate these important events." The Diwali celebration lasts for five days.

During Diwali, families create brightly coloured patterns called rangoli using coloured sand or rice at the entrance to their home to welcome their guests.

Families also decorate their homes with small clay oil lamps called diyas. The light is used to help guide happiness and good fortune into the home.

Family and friends visit each other and celebrate with food and music. They exchange sweets and greet each other by saying,
