
Autism Charity Run

Dear Families,

Thank you for your ongoing flexibility and support as we continue to respond to the recent restrictions as a result of the Covid-19 outbreak in Adelaide. None of us predicted what happened last week, or the change in circumstances when the announcement was made on the weekend that students would return to school on Monday morning.

We appreciate and thank you for the way in which you supported the School Closures on Thursday and Friday and have followed the new drop off and pick up procedures.

As previously communicated, the renewed restrictions meant that we were unable to go ahead with a community event which was scheduled for Thursday. We are waiting on further advice in relation to future events and will keep you informed.

The restrictions also resulted in the instruction that all schools were to postpone planned Closure and Pupil Free Day scheduled for this week. This impacted on our Pupil Free Day scheduled for this Friday.

We are now able to communicate to you the rescheduled Pupil Free Day is on Monday 7th December.

As we head into the last weeks of 2020, we have started planning for 2021. We are pleased to share with you a number of opportunities resulting from successful applications.

Our school has been successful in gaining a position in a Pilot project for Aspiring Global Schools and a BRIDGE project which partners us with Al-Syukro Universal Islamic Primary School in Indonesia.

Both of these projects will provide further opportunities for our students to develop and strengthen their cross cultural understandings and geographical knowledge.

Another exciting opportunity exists for us to further develop our facilities as a result of a government facilities grant of \$70,000.

We are also having discussions in relation to our potential involvement in the Music Strategy and a language program to support our BRIDGE partnership.

We hope that you are all staying safe and well and remind you of the recommendation for adults to wear a mask in situations where physical distancing cannot be achieved.

NAIDOC Week

What a busy week it has been! We had so much fun engaging in different activities to celebrate NAIDOC week. In G1 as part of our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander studies, we have been learning about and celebrating history and culture. We discussed the amount of time since the British fleet arrived in Australia and compared this to how long the Aboriginal people have been here. We created a chain to demonstrate this. Each link in the chain represented 100 years. i.e. 2 white links - represent the time since many immigrants have arrived and hundreds of red, yellow and black to represent the thousands of years Aboriginal people have been here.



We read dreaming stories and discussed Aboriginal connection to the land. For thousands of years, stories have been told via symbols and rock paintings. Students developed their own symbol stories representing their connection to the land. We worked together to complete a NAIDOC art puzzle. We were each given a puzzle piece and came together to put it on cardboard to complete a picture. We were given a flag template and were invited to create our own design that amalgamated the Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islander Australian flag with symbols and colours.



Our week finished on a high with a dress up day on Friday where we were invited to wear the indigenous colours, attended assembly and some of us got our faces painted!



We visited the new Bush Tucker garden with a fire-pit and traditional native plants and herbs. We also spent time with our friendship class, hearing the story of the Rainbow Serpent and then used natural materials to decorate a serpent drawn on the cement.

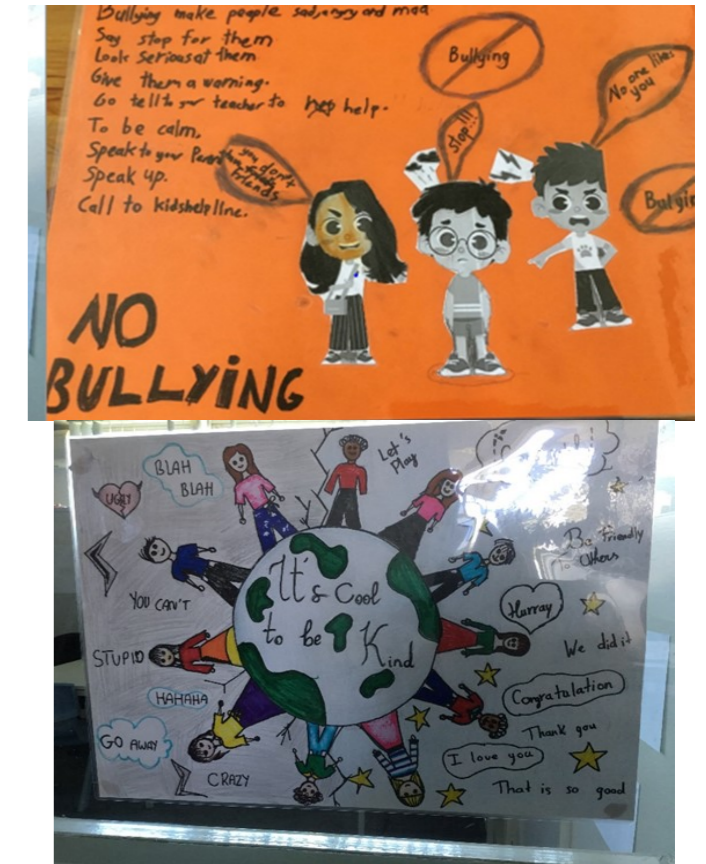
Safety
